These can easily be printed at home, however if you don't want to use up all your ink and want the best quality for your buck, I recommend printing through amazon prints, costco prints, or somewhere local to you like a FedEx Office.

ideas on how to use

- Cut out the "paper dolls" as shown, and glue the folded bottoms on a large piece of construction paper to create your very own nativity scene!
- Cut each character out, cutting off the "fold here" tab and laminate them! (At home or at a local print shop like FedEx Office) then add magnets to the back to put on your fridge, or velcro on felt or fabric.
- igspace Cut out, laminate and punch a hole at the top, loop some twine to create playful ornaments.
- 💠 Use cards as an advent activity leading up to christmas.
- Hang cards up as a banner, to hang on a wall or over the stockings.
- Make a set as a stocking stuffer for the kids!
- igspace The list goes on! Get creative and share on how your using the nativity kit at home!






